DEVOTION FROM PASTOR PAM

"For such a time as this..."

These words come from the book of Esther. We rarely read the book of Esther in church – primarily because the version that is in the Old Testament doesn't even mention God! So you may wonder... how did this story get in the Bible? But it is a great story of reversals and shows that God works through seemingly ordinary people who have no power to accomplish God's good purposes.

Spoiler alert! Skip this summary if you want to read the story in the Bible first! The king threw a banquet for all his (male) friends and, on the seventh day of the banquet (they partied hearty), he asked Queen Vashti to come so he could show off her beauty. She refused. Outraged, the king, on the advice of his officials, banishes the queen. These officials then suggest a beauty pageant to replace the queen. They gather the young women of the kingdom, including Esther, an orphan who had been raised by her cousin Mordecai. Esther won and became queen. But Mordecai warned her not to tell anyone that she was Jewish.

Esther proves to be a faithful wife and queen, including revealing a plot to assassinate the king and she gave the credit to Mordecai for discovering it. All seems to be well in the kingdom. But...here comes the conflict: the king promotes a man named Haman and commands everyone to bow down before him. Mordecai would not because he was Jewish. Haman became furious and determines to destroy Mordecai and all Jewish people. Mordecai appeals to Esther saying: "Do not think that in the king's palace you will escape...If you keep silence at such a time as this, relief and deliverance will rise for the Jews from another quarter but you and your father's family will perish, Who knows? Perhaps you have come to royal dignity for such a time as this." Mordecai was confident that God would save the people. But this was the time for Esther (which means star) to shine. She replies: "I will go to the king, though it is against the law; and if I perish, I perish."

Esther appeals for her life and for the life of her people and after two banquets and plot twists – she prevails. The reversals continue - Haman is hung on the very gallows he had constructed for Mordecai. The day, Purim, that was meant for the extinction of the Jewish people becomes a day of celebration.

In the midst of a pandemic that may last much longer than I, at least, had imagined, it's natural to feel rather helpless. But I began to ask the question,

"For such a time as this... what are we called to do?"

Some are called to serve as medical people in hospitals or as caregivers in nursing facilities that are over-run with illness. Some are called to staff the grocery stores and delivery trucks. None of those jobs are easy or without personal risk. We give thanks to God for these ordinary heroes. But some of us – more of us – are called to shelter at home. It may not seem like much, but it is the support and patience of ordinary people (like many of us) staying home, refraining from gathering together for worship and other events – that is preventing the hospitals from being over-run with sick people.

While the most important thing may be to simply stay put, there are things that we can do at such a time as this. We can pray both for those who are working and for those who are sick; we can support those who are working and those who are lonely by writing letters and making phone calls. We can care for ourselves and one another by engaging on zoom and online worship and Bible study. Even as we tire of wearing masks and of not being able to do all the things we want to do, we are called persevere – even if it takes all summer... even if it takes 6 months, a year, 18 months... And... instead of simply "doing" we can take this time to reflect on what is most important.

As the order to stay-at-home becomes gradually lifted, let us remember that... for such a time as this... our resolve to pray for one another and care for the neighbor is incredibly important and is urgently needed.

My prayers and God's presence are with you "for such a time as this."




