PARKING LOT WORSHIP FOR AUGUST SUNDAYS AT 9:30 AM!

On Sunday mornings at 9:30 AM, worship with us in our parking lot! We will be celebrating communion - you can either: Bring your own bread/cracker and grape juice /wine (safest) or pick up a prepackaged communion cup/wafer. Park your car facing the church building and tune your FM radio to 104.9 FM. (If you have a taller vehicle, please park in the second row so people in shorter cars can see.) We also have speakers during Parking Lot worship. So, if you prefer, you can bring a lawn chair, set up the chair(s) outside (family groups 6 feet apart) and join the service that way! Listed on the white board by the parking lot entrance. The service can also be heard through the speakers that we set up, so if you prefer, bring a lawn chair (or use one of our chairs) and enjoy the fresh air.

The bulletin for the service is online. Please print out, bring, and use it for the worship service. You can also look at it on your phone during the time of Parking Lot Worship. A few copies will be available for pick-up but it is safest to print it out at home.

104.9 FM is currently the best channel for us to use. However, we do not own it so please check the instructions on the whiteboard as you enter the parking lot.

The FM transmitter that we are able to use extends only a short distance - Robbinsway residents may be able to listen from home - but that's about the extent of the listening area.

This summer we will be offering lots of worship options due to the constraints of the pandemic. We hope that you will find an option that works for you! Check out our website or call the office for updates.

As a congregation, we have been blessed by and have been a blessing to Seminary students who serve and learn here at Faith-Lilac Way.

Some things will remain the same... and some things will be different this year as we learn to live with the ongoing threat of the pandemic and figure out how and when to return to worship in our sanctuary. Returning to worship in the Sanctuary. We have a task force that is looking into the safety issues of returning to inside worship. If you haven't had the opportunity to fill out the survey regarding returning to worship inside the sanctuary, please do so (there is a copy on page 5). We are learning how to live safely with the ongoing threat of the coronavirus Covid-19. When we do return to worship, some things will be different - and some will remain the same. We probably will not be able to sing as a congregation or enjoy the music of our choir. We will need to take offering differently. We will need to celebrate the Lord's supper differently. We are getting some experience in this from our Parking Lot Radio worship. As health experts continue to learn more about this virus, we will be paying attention so that we can be as safe as possible when we gather. What will remain the same? We will continue to praise and worship God - whether in our homes, in the parking lot and... one day, in the sanctuary. In the meantime, join us for worship: online, at the parking lot by radio or speaker, using zoom or with the at home mailed bulletins. We are learning to adapt. And that is good!

DEVOTION FROM PASTOR PAM:

Psalms Devotions from Pastor Pam

Psalms, the prayer book of the church, is a good place to turn whether you seek wisdom (Ps1), lament (Ps 13), forgiveness (Ps 51), help (Ps 121), trust (Ps 23) or thanks and praise (Ps 100). These are just examples.

The shortest Psalm is a call to Worship, a reminder that whatever our circumstances, we can praise God:

Psalm 117: Praise the Lord, all you nations!
Worship him, all you peoples!
Because God's faithful love toward us is strong,
the Lord's faithfulness lasts forever!
Praise the Lord! (Common English Bible)

The message is clear: God loves you and is faithful. This is why our response can be praise and thanksgiving. God is with us - no matter what. So rest in God's love and grace. God's love and faithfulness are FOR YOU - and last forever.

AUGUST MISSION OF THE MONTH: KIDPACK



KidPack, is the August 2020 mission of the month. The mission of KidPack is to help stock students and their families

that are in need with non-perishable, healthy yet fun and yummy food items on the weekend at no cost to the parents or to the school.

In 2019 KidPacks hit the half million mark delivering to students in the area. Many of these students are on free reduced meal programs from the school during the week, and then they receive the KidPack on the weekends. During the summer months, KidPacks are offered to the kids that attend Summer School through the district.

A typical KidPack would include a breakfast item, mac & cheese, meat and cheese stick, a juice box, granola bar, applesauce and fruit snack. They are careful to not include items where allergies might affect the students. Because of your generosity with donating to KidPack you are helping save children one meal at a time.

*Right now every dollar you donate will be matched up to \$200,000.

CEAP MEALS ON WHEELS AND NORTHWEST SUBURBAN DINNER AT YOUR DOOR JOIN FORCES!

On July 1, 2020 two senior nutrition programs, Community Emergency Assistance Programs (CEAP) Meals on Wheels in Brooklyn Center and Northwest Suburban Dinner At Your Door (DAYD) in Crystal merged into one program. The combined program has been renamed Meals on Wheels – North Suburban Hennepin County.



Both organizations have served seniors hot, nutritious meals and provided at-home connections with friends since the early 1970's. The combined program continues that mission.

As the two programs merge, CEAP will manage the program, but the day to day operations will look the same. Meals are still delivered from Crystal Community Center. The program

continues to count on church partners and volunteer drivers to deliver noontime meals.

Thank you to Faith-Lilac Way and the DAYD volunteer drivers for your faithful support through the years and for your continuing support. Thank you also to new volunteers, some who might not usually be able to volunteer during the day, who have come forward to substitute for regular drivers who are sheltering at home. This is community at work.




