But first, look back. Who could have predicted a pandemic, a time of racial reckoning and a new way of worshipping online - and in our parking lot? Yet, 2020 brought us all of that. It has been a heartbreaking year with far too many people - friends and relatives too - getting ill and dying from the coronavirus. I am looking forward to the time when we can safely gather again for worship.

On the positive side, who would have guessed that we would be able to worship and hold meetings online? Yet, we have. And we continue to find ways to connect with one another that are high tech - and low tech. I've been thrilled with the number of people who check in with one another through cards and phone calls as well as texts, emails and zoom. In this season of Epiphany - of Christ being made known to us - let us listen with open hearts and let the Holy Spirit guide and bless us all.

I'm eager to look forward. This is the year to move Forward in Faith! As a community of faith, I believe and I hope that we are ready to work with our Wildfire partners and our ecumenical brothers and sisters in Christ to care for our neighbors (nearby and far away) and to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. I AM PAYING ATTENTION.

I think most of us would agree that Christmas this year was different, and I'm taking stock of all the ways it felt 'off'. For me, the most difficult part of the holiday was not being able to see my sister, Jill, and her family. They work in health care, and the risk was just too great. I really missed gathering on Christmas Day as we usually do, relaxing together, and seeing my teenage nephews who seem to be growing at least a half foot every year. Our families are so busy and Christmas Day with them is something I can always count on...except for this year!

Other changes in the season were...dare I say...almost welcome. I felt no pressure to wander the malls endlessly searching for perfect gifts for family and friends. Other than working at church, my calendar was entirely free of social engagements and mandatory outings. I didn't bake or plan a Christmas dinner. We just hunkered down at home, lit candles and prayed before dinners, took walks around the neighborhood, listened to Christmas music, and decorated our tree and house slowly in stages. Our preparation for Christmas seemed more like a slow burn, not the mad frantic rush and consumer excess of years' past.

To be honest, our main focus as a family during Advent was quarantining as much as humanly possible so that we could feel comfortable being with my parents on Christmas Eve. Anja also made it a point to plan out a COVID-friendly environment for Santa and his reindeer: in addition to cookies, milk, and carrots, we also had masks and hand sanitizer available. She was pretty sure Santa was immune from the virus, but as a little COVID-warrior, she knows one can never be too careful.

As I think about Christmas 2020, I'm reminded of this verse from Hebrews: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith..." (Hebrews 12:1-2) This year, I laid aside many weights of the season and felt a certain freedom and peace to make meaning of Jesus' birth in a new way, perhaps in a more faithful way. In fact, I hope not to go back to 'business as usual' next year.

What did you notice about your Advent and Christmas? Did you sense any new invitations from God rising up during this time?

I remain so grateful for this loving congregation during my internship year! May you feel the radiance and liberating power of Christ's coming now and throughout the New Year.




