ASH WEDNESDAY WORSHIP- FEBRUARY 17

Why do we mark the sign of the cross in Ashes on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday? The earliest use of ashes as a sign of mourning, mortality and repentance is found in the Old Testament texts of Job, Esther and Jonah. Christian churches began using Ashes to mark the beginning of Lent as early the 8th century. Today we continue the practice of burning the prior year's palms to create the ashes for our Ash Wednesday services. Marking our fore heads with an ashen cross reminds us of our mortality as we hear

the words: Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return. We are called to repentance for our sins - all of the ways that we have knowingly or unknowingly gone against the will and way of God. But, we are also reminded of the first time that the cross was marked on our forehead with water and the words of baptism were proclaimed. With that cross, you were claimed as a child of God and an heir to eternal life. The ashes are a reminder of both our mortality and the immortality that we are given by Christ.


How do we observe Ash Wednesday when we can't gather? Like so much over the past year, Ash Wednesday will look different this year. We will have an online worship service – and we will be sending Worship At Home bags for Lent. (Let us know if you don't receive one!) In your worship bag, you will find a container of ashes. There will be instructions for either using them dry – or adding a couple of drops of oil to them. Don't add water! A chemical reaction happens when water is added that can cause a burning sensation. There will also be a worship service for Ash Wednesday in your bag – or you can join us online. See our website.

A NOTE FROM PASTOR PAM

You are invited! What do you think of when you hear or see those words? Usually I get somewhat excited – after all - It could be to a party, a celebration or an event. It means that you/ I have been included, that we are wanted.

You are invited to Lent. Hmm. Maybe that wasn't the invitation you were hoping to receive. The invitation to Lent isn't accompanied by balloons. Instead, it involves ashes – a reminder of our mortality and an acknowledgement that we – you and I – need repentance and God's mercy. It reminds us that we – like everyone else – sin, that is, we do, say and think those things that separate us from God. Lent is not a time to point the finger at someone else. This is a time in which we confess that we have not loved God with our whole heart and that we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.

You are invited to experience God's grace. Each week we are reminded "return to the Lord your God who is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding with steadfast love." This scripture from Joel reminds us that Lent, while it includes confession and an honest look at ourselves, it is also a time for growing in faith, for leaning in to the promises of Christ for us and for our neighbor. This year's Sunday Lenten scriptures focus on the covenants – promises - that God made with Noah, Abraham and Sarah, Moses and the Israelites, and the new covenant that comes through the cross of Christ and is made with you, in your baptism.

Friends in Christ, we are invited into the journey of Lent that leads to Easter. It is my hope and prayer that we will be able to celebrate Easter this year together – in our sanctuary. But, whether we are together in person or still online and in the parking lot, we are still a community of Christ who "Grows in faith, Goes in Grace and Serves the Lord!" Thanks be to God!

NOTE FROM VICAR KRISTIN

Did you know that the Greek word in the Bible often translated into English as "repent" is metanoeó, which literally means to change the way one thinks? Metanoeó is used often in the Bible to refer to changing one's mind, changing one's purpose, and changing one's heart in the direction of God's love.

The season of Lent is one in which we are invited to experience changes of the heart. During these forty days, we are reminded of what separates us from God, Lenten MidWeek our neighbors and communities, and creation itself. It is a time when remembering Jesus' passover from death to life, prayer, and works of the Spirit move our hearts closer to God.

What is tugging on your heart strings in this season, dear ones? We all have areas in our personal lives and relationships in need of forgiveness and healing. Our suffering and divided world is also in need of the forgiveness and healing embodied in the gospel of Jesus Christ. The good news is also that we do not face these problems alone, but in community.

Let us deepen community through a five-week Lenten mid-week service series on forgiveness and healing. Embedded in the familiar liturgy of Marty Haugen's Holden Evening Prayer, we will listen to scripture, pray, and meditate on one different aspect of forgiveness and healing each week: forgiving others; forgiving ourselves; seeking God's forgiveness; forgiveness and reconciliation in community; healing creation.

God of glory and humility,





Mission: Fighting Child Hunger
More than 200,000 Children in Minnesota
live with food insecurity. When kids don't
have reliable access to food—such as free
and reduced meal programs at school—the
risk of hunger for children is very real. Every

that children face during the weekends,

Every Meal currently has 4,300 people that volunteer. They sponsor 265 schools, and they have 7809 financial supporters that help to carry on their mission.
