It's Summertime! A time for rest, relaxation and renewal.

Summertime is a great time to relax, to refresh, and to be renewed. This is a time when much of Minnesota heads north to cabins or lakes. It's a good time to take time away. I encourage it!

Last year when I was backpacking in the Bob Marshall Wilderness, we were far beyond the reach of any online services. It was Sunday morning and we had gotten up early to avoid hiking in the heat (the nights and early mornings were cold, the noon and afternoon were unbearably hot). As I started trudging up the side of the mountain that had been burned and left devastated, I was not inspired. I kept thinking about worship - and was missing it. Youth Trip!

The youth have returned after spending a fun and exciting week serving the community in Puerto Rico. The traveling party included nine youth and three adults representing Faith-Lilac Way Lutheran Church, First Lutheran Church of Crystal, and Valley of Peace Lutheran Church. We departed MSP Airport on Saturday July 16 and spent that night at Iglesia Evangelica Luterana San Pablo. On the following day we worshiped with the members of this Lutheran congregation which was founded in 1916. After worship we walked through Old San Juan and then headed to Arecibo.

In Arecibo we worked on three different projects. We worked with farmers in the community who taught us about sustainable agriculture while we worked alongside them. We also worked with homeowners in assisting them with home maintenance and repair and in particular helping with painting. We also served at Sembry Planet which is a non-profit organization dedicated to educating youth about ecology and sustainable living.

In addition to the service work we also had a cultural experience as we took a guided tour of murals in Arecibo. We spent one afternoon at the beach, we enjoyed a salsa dancing lesson, and we also played soccer and basketball with community members. Finally, we ended the week touring a coastal site where *Pirates of the Caribbean* was filmed and we went to the festival that celebrated the 500th anniversary of San Juan.

Each night we worshiped as a community and we also had time to gather with our church group. During this time of worship and community building we took a deep dive into scripture and wrestled with our theological questions while also singing some great songs and sharing our thoughts and feelings with each other.

The week resulted in significant personal growth as all participants experienced new things and made new friends.
