

### Pastoral Article

Do you like change? If someone asked me that question, I would probably say, "It depends."

Some change is expected and even desirable. I like the change of seasons. Even though January in Minnesota can have some brutally cold days, I know I have hot summer days to look forward to – and I have friends who on those hot hot summer days are glad that cooler days are coming. Change keeps things interesting. Can you imagine being the weather forecaster in Arizona? Another sunny, dry day! Likewise, it would be pretty dull if you had to eat the same thing every day (Remember how the Israelites, after being freed from slavery, complained bitterly about having manna every day – even though it was a life-saving gift from God?!) And what child doesn't look up at the "big kids" and want to change to be "big" too?!

But some change is hard. Some changes we would not choose for ourselves. It is hard to lose a loved one, a job, the ability to do something that you love to do. And it is hard when finances are tight and change seems necessary.

At the end of 2020, we had a surprising bonus. But in 2021, we fell short. We have often made up the deficit in December. This year, we did not. Thankfully, the PPP loan was forgiven and so we were able to cover most of our shortfall.

As a council, rather than assigning blame or denying that there was a shortfall, we decided to take a fresh look at our assets. What do we have to offer? What do we want to maintain? What are we willing to share? Again, change can be hard. But it can also provide opportunities for new ways of doing things, new partnerships and new possibilities. It is an opportunity to think creatively and intentionally about our mission and our vision for the year(s) to come, trusting that God is with us – and will lead us as we seek to do God's work in our congregation and the world around us.

One of the things that we value is our relationships with our partners. In our budget, we are maintaining our partnerships – at the same level – with the missions we share and support: The ELCA and our Synod, Lutheran Social Services, Luther Seminary, Near Foodshelf, Every Meal, ELCA World Hunger, Meals on Wheels and Lake Wapogasset Bible camp.

Another relationship that we value is our partnership with our Wildfire churches. In this budget, we are proposing to set aside some funds (\$1000) for a joint grief group. We are also proposing to share our intern for the 2022-2023 year with one or more of our Wildfire partners. Three of the Wildfire congregations already share an intern and there is interest in one or two sharing with us. Our Wildfire Faith-Practices and Neighboring Practices cohort is also exploring new ways to fulfill our mission to share God's love with our congregation and our neighbors. We are a part of the body of Christ and do not and should not operate alone. God gave us partners in ministry!

I believe that the best changes come when they are made intentionally and prayerfully, trusting in God to lead us and direct us. And I believe that this is just what God wants to do. It's God's mission. Please join me at the Annual meeting for a discussion of God's mission (see page 5)

I am enjoying this time of learning and growing as I have had numerous opportunities to preach, teach, and to provide pastoral care as part of my ministry.

Now that I have had the chance to meet many of you and to become familiar with this congregation I am now preparing to start my internship project. My project is going to involve doing what I am calling "internal outreach" to the Faith-Lilac Way community. During the pandemic life has changed so much in all areas and that includes our congregational life as well. One of the goals of this project is to reach out to each household and find out how people are doing and if they have any spiritual or prayer concerns. Another goal is to find out how people have stayed connected to Faith-Lilac Way during the pandemic and to give our members a chance to communicate anything that they would like to see the church provide related to ministry or programming. 


