Pastor's Article

Welcome to the season of Lent.

We still have several Sundays of Epiphany to go – so I don't mean to rush the season. But on this cold below-zero January day, I'm thinking about and planning for Lent. Lent is a period of 40 days (not counting Sundays) leading up to Easter. Unfortunately, often it is seen as a dreary time of giving up something that you don't want to give up and of God – or you--beating yourself up when you fail. If that is your image of Lent, let me assure you, it's not that!

The word "Lent" is a shorten form of the Old English word "lencten" – which means spring season. You can also think of lent as short for "lengthen"... as in the lengthening of days. Maybe you haven't noticed yet, but the days are beginning to become longer. Spring will come.

One of the things that I love about Lent is that it is just long enough—six weeks—to explore ways we can learn about following Jesus. It is a time for us to *lengthen* our imagination of ways we can live into the promises of God. What ideas, hopes and dreams for drawing near to God can we nurture and germinate in six weeks as we notice the lengthening of days? What new faith practice could we try?

During Lent, we will have a table in the narthex with ideas to try such as:

- + a new devotion book geared towards the 40 days;
- + a new prayer practice such as contemplative prayer
- + "lectio visio" seeing God in a new way through art (adult coloring sheets will be available)

There will also be time for Wednesday night Lenten soup suppers and a time to connect with your neighbors as well as worship.

Spring – lencten – is coming. May this time in between now and Easter be a blessing for you!

Start by going to www.faithlilacway.org On our main web page, click on Worship Online With Us, this will take you to the ONLINE WORSHIP page. Click on the LIVESTREAMS button to watch worship services. If you log on shortly before 9:30am, you will most likely see the date of the service displayed. When service begins you will be able to hear and see Sunday's worship service. If you wish to take communion, please have your elements of bread and wine or juice gathered prior to the start of service.

If you weren't able to watch a Sunday service at 9:30am, you would be able to access the recorded service a day or two after the worship service. Follow the instructions above and on the ONLINE WORSHIP page, the video will be accessible by clicking on the forward arrow.

- +Altered Through Stories We Don't Trust?


