Pastor 's Article

Happy New Year!

Are you one to make New Year's resolutions? How are you about keeping them? It can be a challenge. "According to a 2016 study, of the 41% of Americans who make New Years resolutions, by the end of the year only 9% feel they are successful in keeping them."¹ So perhaps "New Years Resolutions" are not for most of us.

However, one thing that I did last year that was helpful was choosing a "word" for the year. Last year, my word was "trust" and my initial Bible verse was from Proverbs:5:6 "Trust in the Lord with all of your heart and lean not on your own understanding." I first learned that verse as a camp or Sunday school song – perhaps some of you know it as well. As I focused on the word "Trust", I found that there were other "Trust" verses that were worth pondering too. From Romans 15:13: *"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."* There are also many "trust" words in the Psalms such as Psalm 91:2 I will say of the Lord, *"He is my refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust."*

In this past year – and most likely the upcoming year – I have found it helpful to focus my "trust" in the Lord and not in myself or in anything else! In this world that asks for our loyalty and our resources in so many ways, I have been glad to focus on God as the one in whom I trust – and not in anything else.

In this new year, I invite you to join me in choosing a word and a scripture for your focus. I haven't chosen my word yet (I may stick with "Trust") but ask me after January 1!

Blessings to you in this New Year. Let us trust in the Lord!

Welcome to Epiphany!

In January we enter the season of Epiphany. Epiphany is the church season following Christmas and before Lent. It begins on January 6th the day commemorating the Magi or "wisemen" coming from the East to see Jesus. In some places, remembering the gifts of the wisemen, this is the day that gifts are exchanged (instead of at Christmas). The season of Epiphany ends on the day before Ash Wednesday, which in 2024 will be February 14. Yes, this means that we will have Ash Wednesday on Valentine's day. Perhaps this will be a chance for God to say: "You are mortal – and I love you" all at the same time.

But what is an ephipany? The Women of the ELCA have a wonderful resource that explores this topic (see below) and offers some exercises to explore. In summary, "an ephipany" can be an manifestation of something – like the Magi coming to the realization that Jesus was the Messiah. It can also be "a moment of sudden revelation or insight," an "aha" moment. Our Sunday scriptures during the season of Epiphany feature several of these "epiphany moments" including baptism, the call to discipleship and prayer.

Happy New Year, People of Faith!

I want to extend an invitation to everyone at Faith Lilac Way to join in conversation as participants in my internship project beginning this January. This is a learning opportunity for all of us. The topic of conversation will be racial injustices that persist in Minnesota.

There is no preparation necessary, and no assigned reading or homework. Each week we'll watch a video that sheds light on a particular problem and its underlying causes, and then discuss what we learned, explore how it impacts us, and try to imagine ways we might help to address the root causes or minimize their impact, whether as individuals, or as a community that cares about our neighbors (who are also children of God) and our neighborhoods. If you don't know what structural or systemic racism is, come and find out. Ask questions. Be curious. Prior knowledge is not required. This is a beginning conversation. We will all learn together. Everyone is welcome. Every voice matters, and enriches the conversation. By participating, you will be helping me learn to create safe, respectful spaces and facilitate open, honest dialogue involving complex, controversial or sensitive subjects—an important skill for my pastoral toolkit.

There will be three Sunday morning sessions after worship: 1/14, 1/21 and 2/4. We will begin in the library at 10:45 AM and finish around 12:15 PM. You do not have to commit to attending every session. Come to as many as you are able. Each session will cover a different topic. If you can't attend in person, but want to participate, contact me or the office, and I will make sure you can attend via zoom. Remember, I work from home sometimes (depending on weather or road conditions), and might miss a call to my office. So, feel free to email me (vicar@faithlilacway.org), or call / text my cell phone 507-279-7527) to opt in or for more information. I'm looking forward to our conversational journey together.

Information for our Congregational Meeting January 28th

As your council has been thinking and praying about our ministry and our budget, there are a few items that we would invite you to pray about with us.

Luther Seminary Internship Program

Faith-Lilac Way has served as an internship site for students at Luther Seminary for the past 15+ years. This ministry has been a blessing to the congregation, to the fifteen interns that we have worked with and to your pastor. This has been an important and vital part of our ministry.

However, some things have changed. There are now fewer interns who are restricting to the Twin Cities area. This is in part due to the fact that there are fewer seminary students now but it is also due to the changing way that Seminary students are taking courses at Luther. Some students are "distance learners" which means that they stay in their home context and do not move to the Twin Cities - and so they do internship closer to home. Other students are part of the MdivX program which is a two year program that incorporates the internship into the class experiences. That program has different requirements for internship. In addition, the cost of an intern continues to rise (it is still a stipend and not a full salary). However, as our expenses are continuing to rise and some building maintenance projects are coming due and our budget is not expanding at the same rate.

As a result of all of these factors, the Council is recommending that we push "pause" on the internship program (after our current intern graduates in Mid-August). There will be more discussion of this at the Congregational meeting in January.

Here are some 2023 highlights you helped to make possible:

We trained and presented to 450 people. Especially impactful are the Confirmation class and parent gatherings, encouraging ongoing conversations to keep youth safe as they navigate these critical years.

We shared our work and resources at many large group events such as Synod Assemblies; Women of the ELCA triennial in Phoenix, AZ; Children, Youth & Family Leaders gathering; Rotary Clubs and more!

Our [Safe & Healthy Relationships Youth Guide](#) is being used with Confirmation classes and Youth groups along with supportive resources for families to work together in keeping young people safe. Traducción al Español ¡Muy pronto! (Spanish translation coming soon!)

We provide education, resources and tools to both adults and youth to promote healthy and safe relationships, guided by our Christian values. Faith communities are powerful agents for social change, and we invite you to join us in protecting all God’s children.

NEAR*

A non-profit volunteer organization, NEAR responds to the needs of people in our community. Through a cooperative effort of twelve area churches, volunteers provide food relief to residents of Crystal, New Hope, Robbinsdale and attendees of all member churches.

Lutheran Disaster Response

Lutheran Disaster Response brings God’s hope, healing and renewal to people whose lives have been disrupted by disasters in the United States and around the world. When the dust settles and the headlines change, we stay to provide ongoing assistance to those in need.

Every Meal

Our actions deliver a positive impact on children and the community through measurable results, continuous improvement, and lasting impressions. Our decisions are focused on the goal of filling food gaps for children living in food insecurity. We always strive for program growth to provide more meals to more children through community engagement, innovation, infrastructure (systems, processes and people) and informed decisions.

Wildfire Every Meal

The Wildfire organization consists of eight ELCA churches within our surrounding community ‘Cross of Glory, Elim, Faith Lilac Way, First Lutheran Church of Crystal, Holy Nativity, House of Hope, St James, and Valley of Peace. This is a collaborative effort between these churches to raise awareness and money that provide funds and people resources that make delivering food to help close those food gaps a reality.

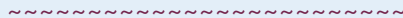
Luther Seminary
