

When I moved to Minnesota in 2010 I was advised to pick up a winter hobby as part of coping with the reality of winter in the North Star State. I have dabbled in both cross country skiing and ice skating but ultimately the winter pursuit that seems to suit me best is catching up with my reading. For any Christian looking for a good read in the winter I recommend the Gospel of John especially the first two chapters. The Gospel of John begins with a beautiful prologue which describes the nature of the incarnation and introduces the idea that Jesus is the one who makes God known. In John 1:4 we read that "in him was life, and the life was the light of all people." This idea of Jesus being the source of life occurs often in John's gospel. It is easy to become discouraged during the cold, dark days of January but focusing on the one who gives life can help keep us from despair. As we see in John 1:5 "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." The light of Christ continues to shine brightly despite all of the turmoil and strife in the world.

The Gospel of John continues with the calling of the first disciples. Jesus invites these new disciples to "Come and see." (John 1:39) We are all looking for a source of hope during another winter of pandemic and Jesus invites us to come and see what he is doing. Shortly after inviting us to "come and see" Jesus then performs his first miracle when he turned water into wine at Cana. For anyone who had doubts Jesus showed that God is an abundant provider who works through common elements to do extraordinary things.

Yes, January is a long month but by the time it concludes we will again have daylight until almost 5:30 in the evening and this light is proof that winter won't last forever. More importantly, the light of Jesus who gives eternal life to all of us will continue to shine no matter what happens in these turbulent times.

Faith Practices and Neighboring Practices

We and three other Wildfire churches were chosen to be part of a learning cohort for both engaging our congregation in deeper faith practices and in learning how to better engage our neighbors. Faith-Lilac Way's team of: Tommy Thompson (current president), Sue Ferkingstad (incoming president); Heather Lane, Rory Joygaard, Vicar Kyle Anderson and Pastor Pam are meeting monthly with the Synod and bringing back some faith practices and some neighboring practices as well. The goal is to not only have a well trained team, but to share these practices with the whole congregation so that we can all deepen our relationship with God and join God in God's work in the neighborhood.


