Pastoral Article

Our FLW Faith Practices, Neighboring Practices team has been meeting together with a cohort of other Wildfire congregations since September 2021. You may be wondering - what have we learned?

I think we have learned - or relearned - the importance of our faith. As one person shared with me years ago, you can't have a good discussion about faith with your neighbor if you aren't grounded in your own faith. "Faith Practices" are about what we do in our daily lives to connect with God because God wants a relationship with each of us. This is not a new or radical idea. But just as the greatest pianist of all times needs to practice, so we too need to *practice* our faith through daily prayer, scripture study, worship and acts of loving service so that the Holy Spirit can work in us and through us.

We are also learning about "Neighboring Practices." In response to the commandment to "love your neighbor as yourself, "a lawyer asked Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus responded by telling the story of the Good Samaritan and then asks the lawyer, "Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?" The replied, "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise."

Jesus' commandment to "Go and do likewise" is clear. Now it is our job to figure out "how." How can we be good neighbors? This is the "Neighboring Practices" part of our work as a team and as a congregation. One of the things that we learned - is really super simple and yet incredibly important: "Get to know your neighbors."

The FLW council and the Faith Practices Neighboring Practices Team had a picnic with the Greater St. John Missionary Baptist on our lawn to get to know one another better. It was a pretty simple event - and yet we learned that what we have in common (we are all one in Christ) is much greater and more important than the ways that we are different. It was a great event - however, it is only a beginning. Just as with faith practices, neighboring practices need to be ongoing - and are not just for the leadership team but are for the whole congregation. And so here is your invitation:

Vicar Article

The time has finally come for the youth mission trip to Arecibo, Puerto Rico. We depart on July 16 and return one week later on July 23. This will be my first airplane trip since January 1, 2019. I have not at all missed the hassles of airline travel which I am sure have not improved since the pandemic. However, in my life I have found that the inconvenience that one may encounter in travel is almost always offset by what is learned by visiting a new place.

I have never been to Puerto Rico so I am really intrigued by the opportunity to visit a United States territory with a rich history where Spanish is the primary language. I have been fortunate to see some very impressive sights as a traveler but what I tend to remember the most from trips are the interactions that I have with the local residents. We will be engaged in community focused service work in Arecibo. During the week we will be working with the Salvation Army, Boys and Girls Club, and other non-profit organizations. Also, compared to a typical YouthWorks mission trip there are more cultural activities scheduled and traditional Puerto Rican food will be included in the menu.

Puerto Rico has suffered terribly in recent years. When Puerto Rico has experienced natural disasters it has not received nearly as much federal assistance as U.S. states do when they are hit with a natural disaster. The people of Puerto Rico were also affected adversely by the Puerto Rican government debt crisis which resulted in taxes being increased on the people of the island while public services and public pensions were cut. Puerto Rico has now officially exited from bankruptcy as of March 15, 2022 but there is still significant hardship being experienced there. Working in the community with Puerto Ricans will enable us to hear about how they have endured adversity as well as their hopes for the future.

Please pray for us while we are away on our mission trip. We will be sharing our experiences in the Sunday morning worship service on July 31.


Tuesdays at 2 PM in July

July 12 is Bible study led by Vicar Kyle. No preparation is necessary.


July 19 is an afternoon social with beverages and snacks. Please drop in for fellowship and good conversation.
