Vicar Article

This is the time of year where students, faculty and staff are thankful for the end of the school year. Summer starts and the pace slows down as there is now time for things which were ignored during the academic year. This summer I am actually heading in the opposite direction of most students. In June I will be returning to the Luther Seminary campus for my first in-person class since the start of the pandemic. I know that taking a class during internship will cause me to be really busy because of the time commitment involved, however the seminary is offering a course on ministering to people with mental illness during the summer term and this was too good of an opportunity to miss.

In our society there is a stigma attached to mental illness. People often do not seek out the necessary treatment because they don't want to be viewed as either weak or crazy. Some people who are close to me live with mental illness each day and these individuals are able to live full lives with meaning and purpose due to the help that they receive from mental health professionals. I also know that many people in our society don't have access to treatment which significantly impacts a great number of people since mental illness impacts the entire family and not just the individual being treated.

I know that in a one week class I will not acquire the knowledge possessed by a trained mental health professional. However, as I start to prepare for the course I have become acquainted with the fact that clergy are likely to be the first people sought out by those suffering from depression or their families. I am looking forward to learning more about mental health resources and the theological and pastoral care issues involved these areas of ministry.


