

# Pastor Article

Two years ago, we began a Minneapolis Area Synod program called **Faith Practices**, **Neighboring Practices**. The purpose of this program is to build the faith and the practice of faith in our congregation and to engage with our neighbors. We put together a team: Sue Ferkingstad, Rory Joygaard, Heather Lane, Tommy Thompson and our intern (first Kyle Anderson and now Joanna Kathol) and I. This team faithfully attended monthly meetings. We learned to listen more deeply, we paid more attention to the psalms and to prayer, we experimented with some new things and we learned - or relearned - a few things too. Here are a few:

- 1)We (ALL) are not done.
- 2) Faith becomes deeper and more meaningful when we take time for God and develop regular, daily faith practices (This is ONGOING)
- 3) This Congregation and the members and friends of this congregation have lots of assets gifts and skills to share;
- 4) The people in our neighborhood have assets too gifts and skills to share.
- 5) We can do it!

This is not rocket science. Engaging with our neighbors and with God is something that ordinary Lutherans can do. And, when we dare to talk with friends and neighbors on a deeper level and when we dare to invite other people to events that we care about, then something different happens than what would have happened if we had not. For example, because people like you personally invited friends and neighbors to the Big Band Bash, we had the largest group we had ever had. Because our council and our team sat with GSJ leadership, we had an honest and deep conversation about the things that we all want addressed in our neighborhood/world. Because the team rearranged the library to make it look like a welcoming place rather than a board room and then invited others to come and have healthy and sweet treats, more people are interacting. More people are staying for the hospitality time after our worship.

Our official monthly meetings have come to an end. However, this does not mean we put the book on the shelf. Now is the time for the work of this team to be spread throughout the congregation and led by the community outreach and service and mission team; the worship staff and committee; the hospitality committee, the property committee; the stewardship committee; the congregational life committee and the finance committee... in other words... all of us.

Many thanks to the Faith Practices Neighboring Practices team: Sue Ferkingstad, Rory Joygaard, Heather Lane, Tommy Thompson and our intern (first Kyle Anderson and now Joanna Kathol) for their dedication to spending the time to learn and to teach faith practices and engage in neighboring practices. The team will no longer meet as a team, however, the service and mission and outreach team will continue to do the work that this team began. They (and you) are invited to join in this work of listening to God and our neighbor and doing small experiments to make a difference in our community and in the lives of us and our neighbors.

#### July Mission of the Month: Every Meal

More than 300,000 children in Minnesota live with food insecurity. Every Meal fights child hunger by focusing on filling the food gaps children face on weekends, extended breaks, and summer when they're not able to access school meal programs. When they don't have consistent access to enough food, the risk of hunger is very real. Through their multiple food gap programs, they provide children and families experiencing food insecurity with access to good food.

Many of our FLW members volunteer for one of the EM programs during the school year. Each Friday, in the kids locker, a food bag is placed in the backpack of a participating kid, providing one weekend meal for the family. The need is real; there has been an unprecedented 34% increase in kids signing up for weekend food

support, making it financially challenging for EM to keep up with the demand.
