Dear friends in Christ,

Have you ever noticed that while there are lots of stories about sheep in the Bible, there aren't so many about goats. Usually goats are just lumped in with the rest of the cattle. Except once. In Matthew, Jesus tells the story of the last judgment and says: "All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the



goats, and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left." No offense to any left-handers, but those at the right hand (the sheep) are preferred and the goats at the left are not. I never thought it was quite fair. After all, while both sheep and goats are a source of meat and wool, goats provide excellent milk and amazing cheese!

But this summer, as I was hiking in the mountains in Montana, I saw a herd of Mountain goats. They were munching on grass in the alpine grove near where we had set up camp. I tried to be quiet so as to not startle them. But one of them was clearly on the lookout. I assumed that he was wondering if we were going to hurt them. So, I said in a gentle voice, "It's ok. We won't hurt you."

It was as if I rang the dinner bell. They all came towards me – and our tent. My knowledge of goats is not vast, but I did know that they will eat just about anything. So we shooed them away. And they came back. Just like kids playing a game of capture the flag, they tried every way imaginable to try to get to our tent. They were so pesky!

But they were also absolutely adorable. So on that day, I understood why they maybe had a bad reputation. But I also gave thanks to God for pesky Mountain goats - a delight to the eyes --- as long as I kept my eye on them so they didn't get into my tent!



### Items to bring for Food and Fund Drive for EVERY MEAL

- **Fruits:** Pineapple, peaches, mango, pears, applesauce, mandarin oranges, mango, prunes/raisins
- **Vegetables:** Carrots, Corn, mixed veggies, green beans, peas, bamboo shoots, baby corn
- **Entrées:** Chili, chicken noodle soup, pasta sauce, mac and cheese, ravioli, enchilada sauce, chipotle in adobo, diced chiles, diced tomato, tomato paste, fava beans, curry soup, coconut milk, curry paste, tomato soup
- **Base/Grain:** Rice, spaghetti, macaroni, oatmeal, corn flour, fideo noodle, rice noodle, bean thread noodle
- Protein: Tuna, chicken, black bean

### Are we there yet?

It's the classic question when you are on the way somewhere - anywhere really - and whoever is asking the question is already ready to be done with the journey. (And it's not just kids).

If we ask the question about the pandemic, I'm afraid that while I was hoping and wanting to be done with covid-everything, it appears that the coronavirus - and its variants and the resulting challenges that come with it - is not done with us.

Following CDC guidelines, Faith-Lilac Way's church council asks unvaccinated people to wear a mask and be socially distant while in the church building. Also, in keeping with the CDC guidelines, we recommend that all people mask and be physically distanced from one another while in the building because of the increased spread of the Delta variant even from vaccinated people. We will continue to offer in-sanctuary worship, parking lot radio worship and online worship. However, if none of these options work for you, please let us know because we also mail bulletins, prayers and the sermon out to those who would like to receive it.

Our Fall programming will be dependent upon how we need to respond to the virus. We are planning to begin in-person classes in September. But the virus has a way of changing our plans. So stay tuned for updates. Contact me with any questions.

As we continue to hope and pray that we will all be able to declare the pandemic "over" soon, let us:

- Trust medical people to be the experts on medicine.
- Help our neighbor who is in need;
- Love one another as Christ loves us.

For if we do this, we will be the community that Christ made us to be. For nothing - not the virus or any other ills - is able to overcome the power of the love of Christ.

Thanks be to God - who continues to work in us and through us.
