#### Pastoral Article



"The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." Lamentations 3: 22-23

We have been singing these verses from the book of Lamentations as our Gospel acclamation this summer - and I find myself humming them at stoplights and singing them in my car on my way home. The rest of the book of Lamentations is just that - a lament at the state of the world, his community, and his own life. But then... in the midst of it all, he remembers that God is loving - and God's grace and mercy are new every single morning. And those words always bring a sense of hope to me.

I love the month of September because it signals the start of new things. Fall marks the beginning of a new church program year. The choir comes back after its summer recess Ann Marie Skoglund-Anderson is inviting you to join them this year! *See page 3.* Education programs begin. *See page 3 for the adult options.* If you have Sunday School age children or grandchildren - see Linda Fernelius. And, if you have confirmation age children or neighbors, see me. No matter your age - it's time to learn something new!

September marks the beginning of school. This year, I will join the ranks of students returning to school. However, I won't be getting on a school bus. Instead, as my continuing education this year, I'll be taking a course called *Tending the Holy at the Christos Center for Spiritual Formation*. Tending the Holy is a Christian ecumenical program that "rests on the premise that we receive the gift to be present and listen to another's story in a healthy way through our own prayerful practices and contemplative experiences of God." It is based on prayer and contemplative prayer practices.

Hello and grace and peace to you, Faith Lilac Way!

Several years ago I was going through a trying time in my life and I was struggling to see where God was at work in me and in my life. I imagine many of us may have experienced moments like this in our own lives. A friend suggested I start keeping a journal and each night before bed I would simply write down a list of where I saw God that day. I decided to give it a try and it was a transformative experience for me and my faith. What I learned was that God shows up in a multitude of wayssometimes in clear gestures-but most often in small, subtle ways that we can often miss. God can be present and sustain us in moments as simple as a smile, a good meal, the warmth of the sun or even a good night's rest.

One of my passions in ministry is to help people find ways that they personally connect to God or experience God in their lives, so don't be surprised if I eventually ask you where you experience God. Do you feel connected to God when you are in nature? When you hear music that touches your heart? In the moments of quiet after a busy day? For the next few weeks I encourage you to keep a journal of your own. At the end of each day take a simple moment to reflect on the events of your day and where you think God was present. She served as Associate Director of Chaplains at the University of Minnesota Hospital and Clinic; Director of Chaplaincy and CPE at Regions Hospital; and as Clinical Pastoral Educator and Chaplain Supervisor (Chief) at the St. Cloud Veterans Affairs Health Care System prior to retiring in 2020.



#### NEAR Foodshelf Says Thank you!


