GOOD FRIDAY STATIONS OF THE CROSS

On Good Friday you will have the opportunity to join Christians around the world in making a spiritual pilgrimage through the Stations of the Cross. A series of fourteen images depicting Jesus Christ on the day of his crucifixion, the Stations of the Cross traditionally depicts the processional route that Jesus walked to the Cross. We will be using images created by artist Mary Button that are reflective of the COVID-19 pandemic. Devotional materials will be available for this self-paced experience. You are welcome to come any time between Noon and 2:00 PM or between 4:00 to 6:00 PM.

SEVEN LAST WORDS TENEBRAE SERVICE

Good Friday is a day in which Jesus reveals the power and glory of God even as he is put on trial and sentenced to death. Tenebrae services have been a part of Good Friday worship services since at least the 9th century. "Tenebrae" is the Latin word for "darkness." In our Tenebrae Good Friday worship services, we will hear the Seven Last Words (passages) of Jesus on the Cross and reflect on them using a modern day picture, prayer, silence and song. After each Word is spoken and reflected upon, a light will be extinguished. We will end in darkness and return on Easter Sunday to the joy of the Resurrection!

After Jesus had spoken these words, he went out with his disciples across the Kidron valley to a place where there was a garden, which he and his disciples entered. Now Judas, who betrayed him, also knew the place, because Jesus often met there with his disciples. Jesus answered, "I told you that I am he. So if you are looking for me, let these men go." This was to fulfill the word that he had spoken, "I did not lose a single one of those whom you gave me." Then Simon Peter, who had a sword, drew it, struck the high priest's slave, and cut off his right ear. The slave's name was Malchus. Jesus said to Peter, "Put your sword back into its sheath. Am I not to drink the cup that the Father has given me?"

+The Holy Gospel John 18:1-11 (NRSV)

The Kidron Valley is not much more than a ditch just outside the East wall of Jerusalem. The garden of Gethsemane is just a short walk up the Mount of Olives, East of the Temple. It is where Jesus goes with his disciples after the Passover Meal. In the Gospel of John, Jesus does not pray for relief but boldly accepts his mission.

The Gospel according to John, the eighteenth chapter. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Lesson 1 Corinthians 11:23-26 (NRSV)

In the bread and cup of the Lord's supper, we experience intimate fellowship with Christ and with one another, because it involves his body given for us and the new covenant in his blood. Faithful participation in this meal is a living proclamation of Christ's death until he comes in the future.

A reading from the eleventh chapter of First Corinthians.

For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

+The Holy Gospel John 13:1-17, 33-35 (NRSV)

Jesus practices what he teaches and preaches. Foot washing was a common act of hospitality in a land of desert dust, providing relief and care to guests. It was a menial job done by servants. Jesus surprises his disciples by washing their feet and commanding them to love one another as he has loved them.

The Gospel according to John, the thirteenth chapter. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Now before the festival of the Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart from this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. The devil had already put it into the heart of Judas son of Simon Iscariot to betray him. And during supper Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going to God, got up from the table, took off his outer robe, and tied a towel around himself. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was tied around him. He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?" Jesus answered, "You do not know now what I am doing, but later you will understand."

Peter said to him, "You will never wash my feet." Jesus answered, "Unless I wash you, you have no share with me." Simon Peter said to him, "Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!" Jesus said to him, "One who has bathed does not need to wash, except for the feet, but is entirely clean. And you are clean, though not all of you." For he knew who was to betray him; for this reason he said, "Not all of you are clean."

After he had washed their feet, had put on his robe, and had returned to the table, he said to them, "Do you know what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord—and you are right, for that is what I am. So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you. Very truly, I tell you, servants are not greater than their master, nor are messengers greater than the one who sent
