

Through our multiple food gap programs, we provide children and families experiencing food insecurity with access to good food. Faith-Lilac Way and other Wildfire churches support Every Meal financially and some of our volunteers go to the local schools to put the bags in the children's backpacks so they will have enough to eat. Lesson Isaiah 40:21-31 (NRSV)

The Judeans in exile have a good reason to be hopeful: the one who will bring them to freedom is the God who created the world, the God who subdues the rulers of the earth and gives strength to those who are weary.

The first lesson is from Isaiah, the 40th chapter.

Have you not known? Have you not heard? Has it not been told you from the beginning? Have you not understood from the foundations of the earth? It is he who sits above the circle of the earth, and its inhabitants are like grasshoppers; who stretches out the heavens like a curtain, and spreads them like a tent to live in; who brings princes to naught, and makes the rulers of the earth as nothing.

Scarcely are they planted, scarcely sown, scarcely has their stem taken root in the earth, when he blows upon them, and they wither, and the tempest carries them off like stubble. To whom then will you compare me, or who is my equal? says the Holy One. Lift up your eyes on high and see: Who created these? Thes second lesson is from 1 Corinthians, the 9th chapter.


