

First Lesson Isaiah 42:1-9 (NRSV)

The first lesson is from Isaiah, the 42nd chapter.

Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights; I have put my spirit upon him; he will bring forth justice to the nations. He will not cry or lift up his voice or make it heard in the street; a bruised reed he will not break, and a dimly burning wick he will not quench; he will faithfully bring forth justice. He will not grow faint or be crushed until he has established justice in the earth; and the coastlands wait for his teaching.


Second Lesson Acts 10:34-43

The second lesson is from Acts, the 10^{th} chapter.
