



First Lesson Isaiah 64:1-9 (NRSV)


The first lesson is from Isaiah, the 64th chapter.

O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence—as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil—to make your name known to your adversaries, so that the nations might tremble at your presence!
